Make Snow Sculptures:

Paint your snow sculptures using Kool Aid, food colouring or paint.

Set up an outdoor snow kitchen.

Use sand toys to make snow castles.

Create a snow volcano.

















Ice Block Bowling

Use empty juice containers or milk cartons to create ice blocks as pins. Kids roll a ball (like a soft dodgeball) to knock them down.

Frozen Treasure Hunt

Hide small toys or treasures in a snow area and provide clues or maps for kids to dig and find them

Snow Fort Building

Create teams and let children work together to build snow forts using molds, buckets, or shavels.

Winter Obstacle Course

Set up a course that includes snow tunnels, snow mounds to climb over, or hurdles made of cones and ropes.

SNOW DOUGH RECIPE

1 cup of corn starch
1 cup of lotion

HOW TO MAKE A SNOW VOLCANO

<u>Materials:</u> A cup or plastic bottle Baking soda Vinegar Food coloring

HOW TO MAKE SNOW FOAM:

<u>Materials:</u> 4 cups of frozen baking Soda 2-4 cups of shaving Cream

Instructions:

Add the desired amount of frozen baking soda to a sensory bin or container.

Slowly begin to mix shaving cream into the baking soda, slowly adding more shaving cream and mixing until the desired consistency is reached.

Materials:
A jar or similar container

Winter Carnival Bingo

Create bingo cards with winter-themed pictures like snowmen, sleds, mittens, penguins, or hot cocoa.

Pin the Carrot on the Snowman

A winter spin on "Pin the Tail on the Donkey," where kids try to place a paper carrot nose on a snowman blindfolded.

Indoor Ice Fishing

Use a kiddie pool or bins filled with "ice" (paper snowflakes or white packing peanuts) and magnetic fish. Kids use poles with magnets to "catch" fish.

Winter-Themed Story Corner

Cozy up a space with blankets and cushions for winter stories like The Snowy Day or Bear Snores On.

Polar Animal Puppet Show

Set up a puppet station where kids can create and perform their own polar-themed shows using premade sock puppets.

<u>"Snowball" Fight (Indoor Soft Version)</u>

Use soft white balls (like foam or crumpled tissue paper) to create a fun, safe snowball fight zone.

Marshmallow Building Challenge

Use toothpicks and mini marshmallows to build snowflakes, towers, or winter shapes.

Winter Dance Party

Play upbeat music and host a dance-off. Add "freeze dance" where kids freeze like statues when the music stops.



Winter Parade

Invite families to decorate wagons, strollers, or bikes with winter-themed items for a small parade.

Campfire and Storytelling

Set up a safe outdoor firepit with cozy blankets, marshmallows for roasting, and storytellers sharing winter tales.

Photo Booth

Create a winter-themed photo area with props like scarves, hats, fake snow, and a backdrop of snowflakes or mountains.

Talent Show or Winter Skit

Children can prepare winter-themed songs, dances, or short performances for families.

Winter Carnival Passport


Give each child a "passport" to collect stamps for completing activities (like snowball toss, crafts, or races).


They can redeem a small prize at the end.





