



WATER

Sink or Float Science

Fill a bin with water and add objects for testing. Ask kids to guess and then observe what sinks or floats.

Water Painting

Give children brushes and cups of water to "paint" outdoor surfaces.

A mess-free and engaging creative outlet.

Ice Excavation

Freeze small toys in ice blocks.

Provide tools (droppers, warm water) to melt and rescue items.

Musical Water Glasses

Fill glasses with various water levels.

Tap gently with spoons to explore pitch and sound.

WATER GAMES

(No Swimsuit Needed)



Sponge Toss

Use large, soaked sponges and toss them to a target or each other.



Drip, Drip, Splash!

Like Duck, Duck, Goose—but with a wet sponge!

Water Relay (with Cups or Spoons)

Teams carry water in cups or spoons to fill a bucket.



Leaky Cup Race

Kids carry a cup with holes to fill a container.



Ice Cube Treasure Hunt

Melt or find small toys frozen inside ice cubes

Under the sea loose parts box

Include an assortment of loose parts linked to under the sea.



What else will you add?

Under the sea sensory play

You will need:

- bowls
- sand
- coloured water
- shells
- glass pebbles
- spoons

Fill the bowls with the sand, water, shells and pebbles.



Explore the contents of the bowls.

You will need:

- sand
- tray
- sticks
- loose parts



Fill the tray with a layer of sand.



Create frames with four sticks and add loose parts.



Make under the sea art using the nature and loose parts.



Rain potions

You will need:

- jars
- nature
- food colouring



Fill the jars with nature finds or add a few drops of food colouring into the bottom.



Leave outdoors on a rainy day to fill up with rainwater.



Once full, use the jars to mix, stir and create your very own rain potions.
